



Academic Resources from TOP Universities

Academic resources from UPenn (Graduate School of Education, Wharton Business School, and the School of Engineering) and UCSB provide GYEC with a solid academic foundation. Participants will learn about entrepreneurship and innovative practical courses taught by professional instructors from UPenn &UCSB to prepare them for the competition.



Breaking Boundaries and Cross-Cultural Discussions

Through the most authoritative and prestigious entrepreneurship program, participants will have direct dialogues with Silicon Valley elites and Ivy League professors. The winning team of the USA finals will be invited to compete with other winning teams in the global finals where they can meet outstanding young entrepreneurs from all over the world!





Mentoring by Elite Executives from Silicon Valley Companies

Participants will independently complete sustainable development projects and complete their final pitch under the guidance of professional mentors from Silicon Valley. Participants will discuss the various problems encountered in the project and product design process with the Silicon Valley elites and learn the most feasible, practical solutions.



True Journey of R&D and Product Design

Participants will start with the UN 17 Sustainable Development Goals and discover the various problems that exist in the real world. They will work together in the form of a team, use their respective strengths, and finally find an effective solution. They will transform this solution into a feasible and sustainable entrepreneurial innovation project.

Entrepreneurship Mindset

Throughout the competition, participants will directly learn from real-world business leaders and academic elites. Through an authentic learning approach, participants will be equipped with the entrepreneurial mindset: decisiveness, responsibility, self- confidence, humility, and optimism.

02



Transferrable College Credits

Participants will enroll in the UCSB Entrepreneurship Pre-College Program. After completing the program, participants will receive two transferrable college credits, an official transcript, and recommendation letters from UCSB professors.

03



Theory and Practice

Throughout the competition, participants will design and build a feasible and sustainable businessplan aligned with the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals.

04



Official Certificate and Scholarship

After completing the competition, the participants will receive Their certificates of participation provided by the GYEC Committee. The winning teams will receive an entrepreneurship scholarship of up to US\$10,000!

Apply for Preliminary Round and Form a team

- The Preliminary Round Application fee is \$100 per person, including GYEC platform usage and other competition-related materials. If you already have a team, please include your team name in the application form (the team name can be changed during the competition).
- All participants will be invited to GYEC platform to access to all competition information.

02

Submit Preliminary Round Materials

- Individual Submission Requirements:
 - Short Essay Question (Maximum 100 words)
 - A profile picture
 - Self-introduction video (30 seconds)
 - Biography
- Team Submission Requirement:
 - Team Project Proposal (8-pages slides/deck)

Register for Division Final Round (June 15- June 30)

- The GYEC committee will announce semi-finalists within 4 weeks after holistic application review. EARLY SUBMISSION, EARLY DECISION!
- The GYEC committee will announce semi-finalists within 4 weeks after the holistic application review.
- All semi-finalists gain admission to the Division Final Round, including a college-level Entrepreneurship course with 2 credits. No standardized tests (e.g., TOEFL, IELTS) are required upon admission for international candidates.

Submit Final Round Materials and Live Pitch on July 30

- All teams must submit final pitch slides no later than July 29 at 11:59 PM PST.
- All teams will have 8 minutes to pitch and 5 minutes for Q&A on July 30.
- All teams will attend the Award Ceremony on July 31.



- Participants who enter the Division Final Round can apply for the UCSB program without submitting standardized tests (such as SAT/ACT, TOEFL, IELTS, etc.)
- After completing the whole GYEC Curriculum, participants will receive TWO transferrable college credits, authorized certificates, an official transcript from UCSB, and recommendation letters from UCSB professors/GYEC Committee.
